

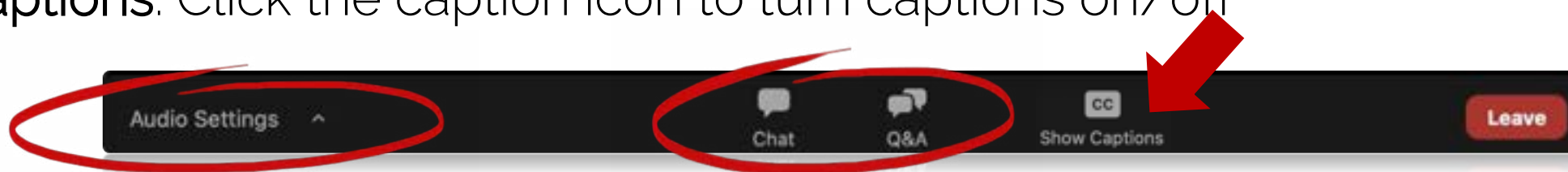
The Sunrise Association Wheels Up! Program: Bringing the Joys of Childhood to Hospitalized Cancer Patients

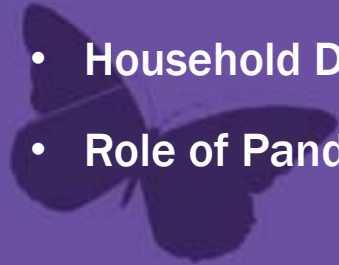

Sunrise Association Day Camps

- Started in 2006 in Long Island.
- World's first full summer day camp for kids with cancer and their siblings, free of charge.
- 96 campers in 2006 to over 2,000 in 12 camps across the U.S. and Israel today (13th in December)



Why Day Camps?

- Campers sleep in their own beds.
- Close proximity to doctors and hospitals.
- Full eight-week summer experience, compared to shorter stays at other camps.
- Respite for parents and caregivers without commitment to sleep away camps.



Sunrise on Wheels

- Started in 2009 by Bonnie Flatow to bring the magic of Sunrise into pediatric oncology wings in hospitals and medical facilities.
- Colorful tie-dye footlocker trunks on wheels filled with toys, games, crafts, music rolled into pediatric oncology wings in hospitals.
- 25 hospitals worldwide, engaging with 6,000 kids annually.

30-minute adventure program transporting kids from the hospital to fascinating places worldwide.

WHEELS UP!

- **Growth:** 7 seasons, over 100 episodes, currently shown in 157 hospitals and medical facilities around the world and growing every week.
- **Partnership:** Collaboration with American Airlines, featuring pilots or crew in episodes, branding and AA destinations. Partner with pCare, Give Kids the World Village, Ryan Seacrest Studios and more.
- **Passport Kits:** Given to children to follow along and engage.
- **Wider Reach:** Not limited to kids with cancer; offered to everyone in the facilities.
- **Viewing Platforms:** Available on hospital closed-circuit TVs, tablets, YouTube, and the Sunrise Studios app.



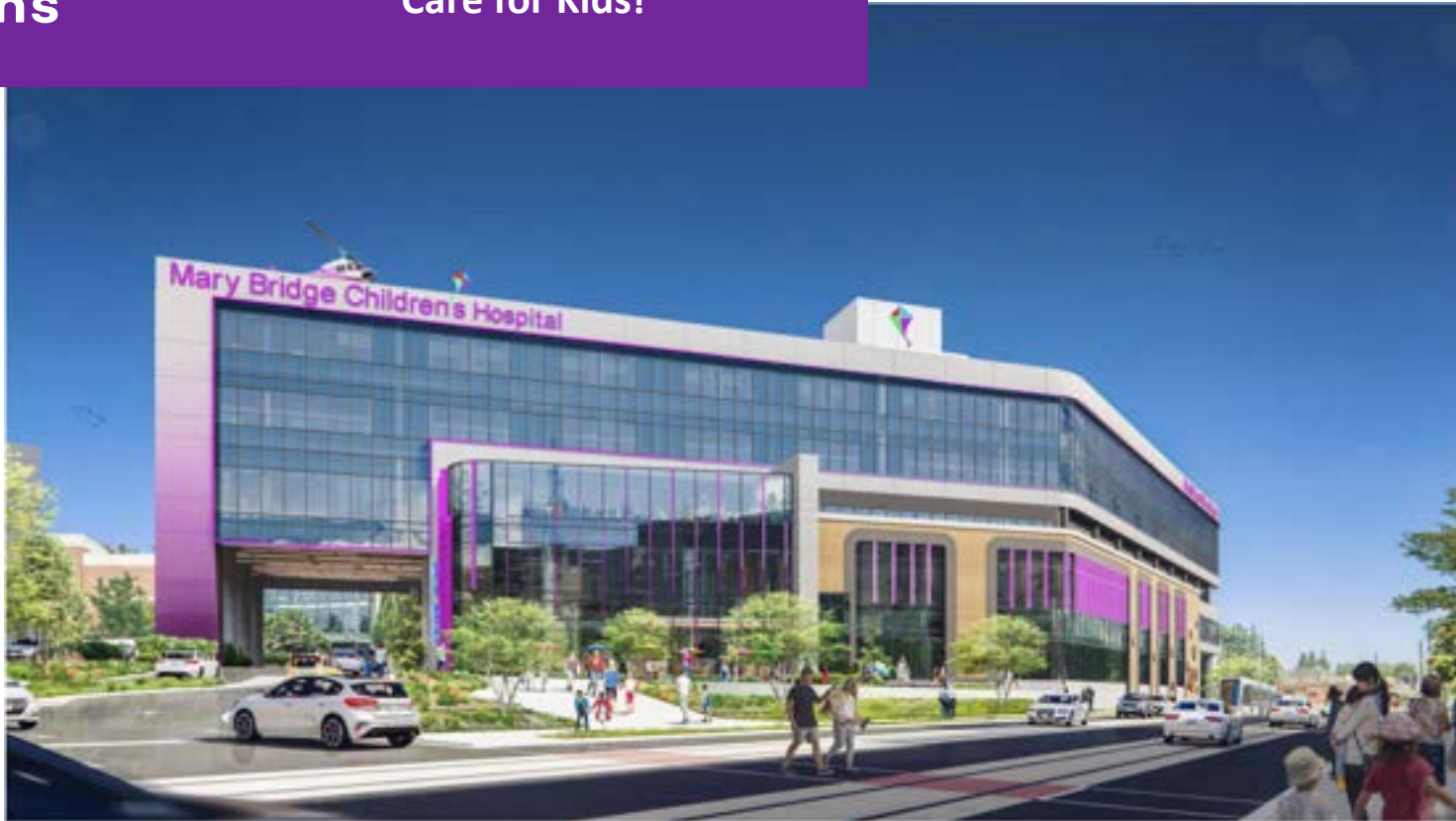

MARY BRIDGE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL AND HEALTH NETWORK TACOMA, WASHINGTON

Highlights:

- 1 Acute Care Hospital – Tacoma (82 pediatric beds & 70 bed NICU)
- Trauma 2 Pediatric Emergency Room – Tacoma
- 4 Urgent Care Centers
- 13 Primary Care Clinics
- 6 Therapy Centers

New Hospital Building:

- 96 total beds (82 built out and 14 shelled for future growth)
- 8 operating rooms (including 2 shelled ORs); 1 pediatric cardiac catheterization/interventional radiology and 2 endoscopy suites
- Shared pre-post/PACU and sedation
- 26 emergency department exam rooms including 8 reduced risk rooms
- Diagnostic Imaging

- Inpatient units

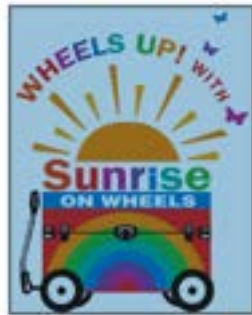
Wheels Up! In Action

Wheels Up! Getting Started



- Incorporating our own “Passport”
- Pre-Made Grab N Go Kits
- Partnered with pCare to provide kit instructions on TV’s
- Volunteer engagement
- Chose to start slow (2 destinations at a time) and add over time
- Making the program available for all kids/families
